Ever since becoming a car guy, I’ve been a bit of a nut for automotive serial numbers.

I used to love deciphering serial numbers on cars and being able to rattle off the ones on the more interesting cars. I knew things like being able to use the chassis number of an early Ferrari to tell whether it was a road car or race car (road cars ended with odd numbers, race cars with even ones). Or when you called the Lamborghini factory for parts, they went by engine number, not chassis number. And that during the first few years of production, Saleen Mustangs were numbered with a decal on the left front bumper. It all drove me crazy, and I loved chasing the numbers.

To this day, I’m still a numbers fan. Whenever I see another 1991 Miata, I immediately check the VIN to see how close it is to my own car, as well as its relationship to car 209447, the first car with a long-nosed crankshaft. Unfortunately, Mazda never ran the Miata VINs sequentially, so while your Miata may be 000001, the vehicle with 000002 could have likely been a pickup, minivan, or some other model.

My own car, 234012, is nothing particularly special in the hierarchy of Miata history. It was merely the 34,012<sup>th</sup> Mazda built in 1991.

So imagine my surprise when, at a recent CAR Miata Club tech day, another member pulled up in a red/black 1991 with a VIN merely 11 cars different than mine! Suddenly, the two cars had a relevance to each other. And even more recently, I discovered one of our new members' cars was only 154 after mine.

Three cars, all from different backgrounds, and who probably shared a container ship across the Pacific, have found each other once again. And even their owners now share something as well.

So the next time you're at a CAR Miata Club event, or even if you see a Miata on the street, I encourage you to take a moment and see if your car is once again reunited with its production siblings.

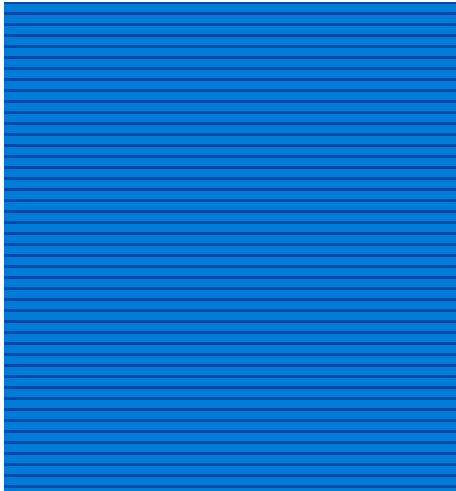
